First Holy Communions

School Website

We are currently in the process of changing our school website and hopefully the new one will be up and running in a few weeks. Therefore the existing one will not be updated as we begin the transfer over of information. Once we have a launch date for the new website I will circulate details.

Attendance

See below the current attendance figures per class for this week. Our target is over 96% & unfortunately this week we have not achieved this. Holidays in term time cannot be authorised & may result in a fine of £60 per child. Any children with attendance below 90% are classed as being a 'persistent absentee' & school have to work closely with parents to ensure that improvements are seen. We also will have our Sefton Education Welfare Officer on site doing a 'late gate' as we have concerns about the number of children arriving late each day. Children need to arrive by 8.40am as the gates will be locked at 8.45am & children need to be in class at 8.45am ready to start their school day. This applies to all classes in main school including Reception class (Nursery start at 8.45am). Any children arriving after 8.45am will need to be signed in late at the school office. Breakfast Club starts at 7.45am with last entry being 8.35am.

We are very proud of our new lending library here at St William of York. It is ideally situated in the heart of the school and one of the benefits is that children are able to borrow books and take them home. This is a fantastic opportunity for children to explore new and exciting books, which they can read at leisure at home.

Each week, children will have the opportunity to use the library with each class being allocated a time to visit it. Children will have increasing independence in selecting their library books. While this will be guided to some extent by the class teacher, your child may bring home a book which is not necessarily matched to their reading ability, but has appealed to them. Children will be able to take home the book they`ve chosen and then will get an opportunity to swap it at their next library session the following week. However children will only be able to swap their books if they have returned the previous one. In order for the whole school to benefit from this fantastic resource, we ask that you review the Library Home / School Agreement below.

PLEDGES FOR THE PARENT/CARERS AND PUPIL:

- We will ensure that the library books are treated with respect and that we take good care of them.
- We return books that we have borrowed promptly and in good condition.
- We understand that a charge of £5 may be incurred for any lost or seriously damaged books (this charge will be put towards a replacement book).

Book Swap

We now have a free book swap located in the foyer by our office. A book swap is an easy and fun way to swap books you no longer need for books you want to read! Please come along to see the books on offer and join in- don't forget to bring something to swap! Book Swap Rules 1. You can leave as many books as you like but please only take one book home at a time. 2. Make sure that the book(s) you are leaving are your own. 3. Make sure your book(s) are appropriate, clean and in good condition. 4. Make sure that you leave the shelf tidy and keep your swapped book in good condition. 5. Bring your book back once you have read it and swap it for another. Many thanks

Pupil Premium Funding/Free School Meals

As a school we receive additional funding, called Pupil Premium, for children whose parents are on lower incomes and are receiving certain benefits. This additional funding is used to benefit the children by funding additional staff to work with smaller groups, uniform vouchers, some school trips and other specific resources. It is therefore really important that parents who are eligible for Free School Meals apply. This includes parents of children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 who get a free school meal anyway under Universal Free School Meals (UFSM). If you get Income Support, Jobseekers allowance, Employment Support Allowance, Child Tax Credit only, Universal Credit and have a net household income of less than £7,400 per annum (£616.67 a month) or receive support under the Immigration & Asylum Act then your child should be eligible for this additional funding. If you are in receipt of Working Tax Credit you are not entitled. If you are eligible we encourage you to please complete a form available from the school office.

Nursery Places

We have a limited number of places still available so if you have children of nursery age or know of friends/family who are looking for places and are new to the area then please get in touch to arrange a visit to our fantastic facility.

Pastoral Care Lead

Mrs Williams is on the yard every morning before school should you have any queries or need any advice, you can also speak to her about any concerns you have around your child in class and then she can speak to the class teacher (She will have on her high visibility jacket so can be easily identified). You can also make an appointment to speak to her should you wish to discuss something further.

ParentApp

It is really important for communication that all parents download our ParentApp as this is our main communication method to keep in touch with what's going on in your child's class and school. We can also email through ParentApp for those that can't get the App. Thank you to all parents who are using the school app, over 93% altogether, which is brilliant. If you haven't downloaded our ParentApp yet, we have sent you a link, which might be in your spam emails, so look there if you can't see it in your inbox. Any problems please let the school office know.
